What this course involves
Planned study - 5 hours weekly to support lesson content

Course Start Tasks

(to be completed over the summer and handed in at your first lesson)

TASK 1:

Watch the short film 'Stutterer' online:

https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=4dU1Y0Y_YdxQ

Write a short essay outlining what you think the main message of the film is and what techniques it uses to communicate that message. (750 words minimum)



Focus on some of the following key elements of **film form** :

- **Cinematography** : camera shots such as close ups ,wide shots , camera movement e.g pan, lighting and colour
- **Editing** : how and why one shot follows another, or how the sequence is structured
- **Mise-en-scene** : background, setting, objects , props or costume
- **Sound** : music, dialogue ,voiceover , sound effects etc.
- **Performance** : body language, facial expression, posture etc.

TASK 2:

Based on films and genres you know well, create **synopses** (summaries) for **two original short (5 minute) films you could create** (200 words approx)

- This should include detail about the following :
- Narrative and plot
- Use of genre codes and conventions
- Key characters

You can also refer to other films that have influenced your ideas and can include visual images. You will be “pitching” these ideas to your “producer” (teacher) when you start the course and they should be the starting point for your coursework.
