How will my Course Start learning be used in lessons?	TEXTUAL ANALYSIS The study of genre codes and conventions is a key concept explored in both year 1 & 2. We deconstruct (decode) the meaning/s that have been constructed (encoded) by the producers of the text. If you have not studied Media Studies before, you will be surprised about how much you already know from your own consumption. You will be exploring the genre codes and conventions used in set texts by using the skills of denotation (sign) & connotation (signified).
