<b>What this course involves:</b>
Completing Planned Study (independent learning) of 5 hours per week.
The 2 year course is 60% Coursework & 40% Exam

Following briefs set- this includes researching, planning and taking photography shoots, experimenting, and creating a set of final images
Learning the technical and creative aspects of photography
Planning for Photoshoots on varying locations
Participating in planned trips to shooting locations
Visits to Photographic & Art Exhibitions
Learning to use 'Available Light' when shooting
Using new techniques; Studio, Digital Darkroom (Adobe Photoshop) Wet Processing & Printing, Digital Inkjet Printing and creating a Digital Logbook using Google Slides
Evaluating and reflecting upon own progress in Digital Logbook in Google Slides
Developing independent learning skills (e.g. time management, preparing for each week's lessons, completing Google Slides learning tasks outside lessons)
Using & developing your selection process to produce coherent 'exhibition standard' final imagery.

# 'Course Start' tasks

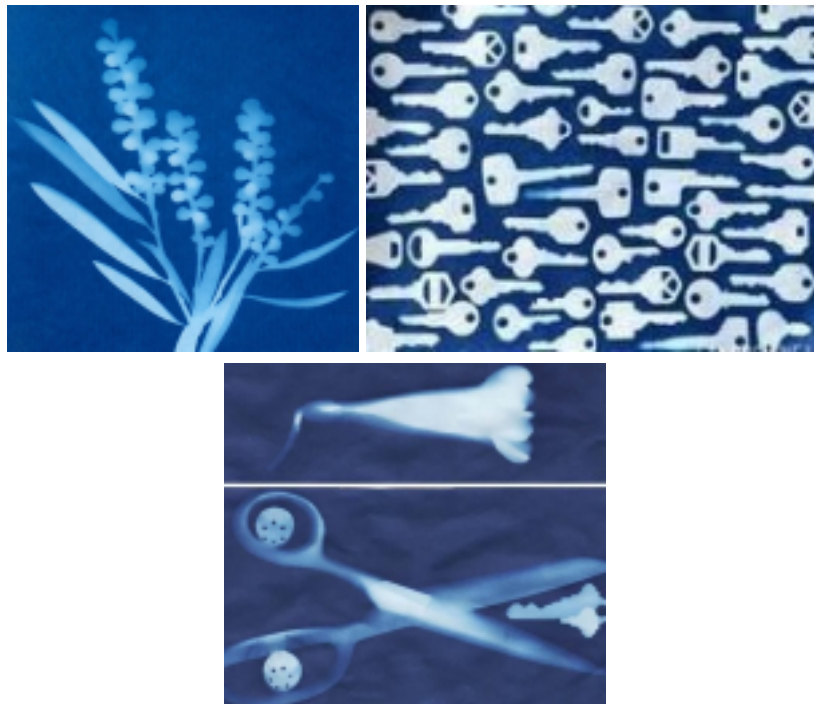
Welcome to GCSE Photography
