What this course involves
Completing Planned Study (independent learning) of 5 hours per week.
Writing tasks involving a range of practice exam questions (e.g. short answers of one paragraph up to essays of 1-2 sides
Application of numerical skills including analysing graphs and data, plus using statistical analysis (e.g. standard deviation)
Participation in 1 externally-assessed Unit (2 -hour examination) at end of Year-1 which goes 35% of the final grade of the qualification
Completing 3 coursework units (65% of the BTEC grade) which will entail forming an evaluation, participating in compulsory activities, working with others in the group, writing conclusions and developing improvement plans.
Engaging in discussions and presentations based on the themes studied.
Studying a diverse range of themes: • Teamwork and leadership styles, communication skills, teamwork skills. • Behaviour and discipline - conformity, compliance and obedience, self-discipline, key psychological perspectives and research, Stress and high tension situations • Outdoor adventurous activities, • Career development and planning
Developing independent learning skills (e.g. time management, preparing for each week's lessons, completing learning tasks outside lessons)
Participating in at least three days of organised outdoor activities across the two-year course (there will be a small charge for this)
